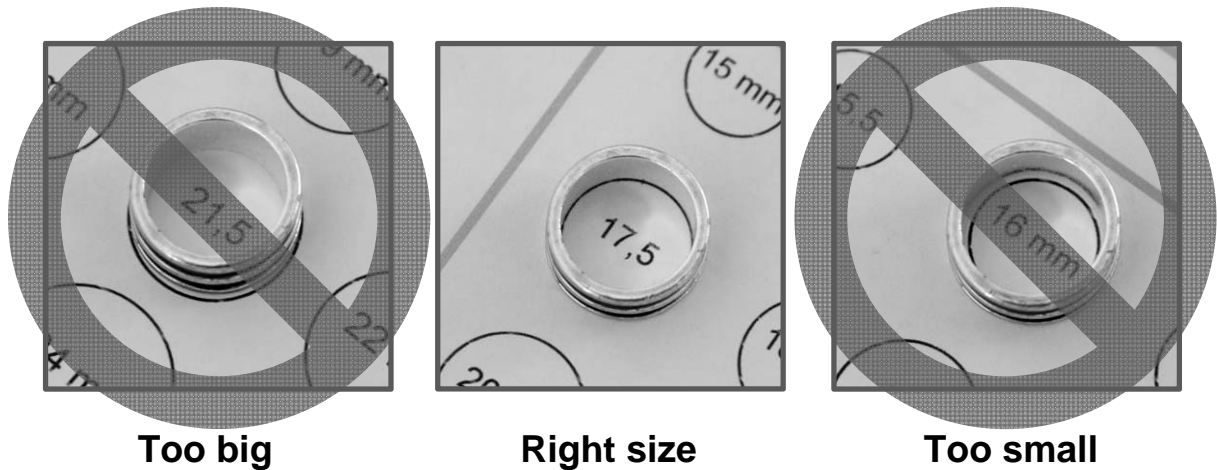


## Finding Your Ring Size

In order to find your ring size, please follow these two steps:

**Step 1 –** Print the Ring Size Finder page (next page). For accurate ring-size results, you must make sure that you do not have “Shrink oversized pages to fit paper size” or “Expand small pages to paper size”, “align page”, “reduce to adjust page”, “fit to page”, “print as image” or any other alignment function selected in the Print dialog box.

**Step 2 –** Place a ring of your own that fits you over one of the circles. The correct size is the one that makes the inside of the ring line up with the outside of the circle. If you are between sizes, order the larger size.



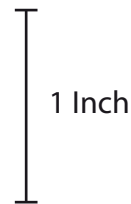
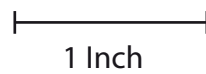
### Additional comments:

- Try to use as a reference a ring with a similar shape to the one you are buying in Contemporary Jewelry Store.
- A good practice may be to visit a jewelry store in your town and ask for the dimension in millimeters of the inner circle diameter of a ring that fits you.
- The sizes on the Ring Size Finder may suffer distortions according to the configuration of your printer. The purpose of this guide is to help identify the approximate ring size, but is not a risk free method.



**IMPORTANT**

To guarantee that the Ring Size Finder was printed accordingly, use a ruler to check if both scales below have 1 inch. In case of any difference, reprint and be sure all printing align functions are not checked.
